- 1. Put an asterisk or star next to the highest total. You may have more than one row totaling this same amount. Put an asterisk or star by each.

- 3. Write the name of the gift(s) that match in the box at the bottom of this page. What is written may very well be the spiritual gift(s) of the person taking the test.

<u>Note</u>: if the highest total is under 10 for any gift, this test should probably be considered inconclusive. More ministry experience may be required in different areas of ministry. Very possibly the highest total may be the gift but totals of 10 or less should be seen as tentative.

4. If there are any totals with no more than a one-point gap from the highest total, yet still over ten, you may want to write that gift(s) down as a possible gift(s) as well. If however, you find that this yields more than three gifts, you probably should go with only the highest total as the more conclusive gift(s).
